STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Town of Atkinson for Pauper Support of George E. Ellis.

Town of Atkinson; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$121 to be paid to the Town of Atkinson for supplies and medical care furnished George E. Ellis, state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In August 1961, the Town of Atkinson paid medical and burial expenses in the amount of \$359.19 for George E. Ellis, a state charge. The town was reimbursed on October 12, 1961 in the amount of \$238.19. The difference of \$121, \$85 for burial and \$36 for doctor's visits, was not allowed by the Department of Health and Welfare. The selectmen of Atkinson feel that this difference should be met by the State in view of the size and financial status of the town.
