STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Town of Brownville for Freight Charges on Surplus Foods Distributed to Unorganized Territory.

Town of Brownville; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$149.12 to be paid to the Town of Brownville for 25% of the freight charges on surplus foods distributed to people in the unorganized territory (Williamsburg and Sebois).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This amount represents the percentage of freight on surplus foods distributed to people living in unorganized territory (Williamsburg and Sebois):

1960-1961	25% of freight on surplus foods	\$ 32.70
1961-1962	28% of freight on surplus foods	116.42

This claim is being presented due to the fact that some towns are being reimbursed for the freight on surplus food distributed to residents of unorganized towns and plantations by the Department of Health and Welfare. This bill was presented to the department on April 5, 1962. The department refused to pay the bill stating that the reasons for refusal was due to the lack of funds. Due to the fact some towns are being reimbursed for the transportation charge on these items, the Town of Brownville feels it should be reimbursed.
