STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Prohibition Against Loitering on Private Property or Peeking Therein.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 137, § 41-A, additional. Chapter 137 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 41-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 41-A. Loitering on private property; peeking in the nighttime. Whoever loiters, prowls or wanders upon the private property of another, in the nighttime, without visible or lawful business with the owner or occupant thereof; or who while loitering, prowling or wandering upon the private property of another, in the nighttime, peeks in the door or window of any building or structure located thereon and which is inhabited by human beings, without visible or lawful business with the owner or occupant thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than 6 months or by a fine of not more than \$500, or by both.'
