**AN ACT Relating to False Report of Deposit of Bombs or Other Infernal
Devices.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 130, § 22-A, repealed and replaced. Section 22-A of chapter 130 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 262 of the public laws of 1957, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 22-A. False report as to bomb. Whoever calls out or causes to be called out any fire department, police department or other municipal department, sheriff department or State Police, or any portion or persons thereof, by intentionally giving a false report as to the deposit of any bomb or infernal machine in any public place, public or private school, hospital, industrial plant, business office, store, or in or upon any public conveyance, including but not limited to aircraft, or causes the evacuation thereof by such false report, knowing such report to be false, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 5 years, or by both. If such report or evacuation involves a private home or conveyance or other private place, the punishment shall be by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both.'
