STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT to Incorporate Maine Hospital Association, Inc.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. r. Corporators. Philip K. Reiman, Sister Mary Mercy, Elizabeth M. Cousins, John W. Smith, Jr., Matthew I. Barron, James L. Hood, William Schofield, Carleton F. Davis, Etta M. Dodge and Raymond H. Walton, and all persons who may hereafter become associated with them, are hereby created a charitable corporation by the name of Maine Hospital Association, Inc.; for the purpose of promoting the welfare of the people of Maine through the development of hospitals and hospital services, to encourage professional education and scientific research, and promote and assist in the health education of the people of Maine, to maintain affiliation with the American Hospital Association as from time to time may be mutually desired; to cooperate and assist other organizations having similar objectives and do all things to promote better patient care and hospital efficiency; and by that name shall have power to sue and be sued, and possess all the rights and privileges of corporations under the laws of this State.

Sec. 2. Officers; bylaws, etc. Said corporation may elect such officers as it may deem necessary, and may adopt such constitution, bylaws, rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of this State, as it may deem proper, for the management of its affairs, including the admission, government and expulsion of members.

Sec. 3. First meeting. The first meeting of the corporation may be called by any one of the persons named in this act, by mailing, postage prepaid, notice of the time and place of such meeting to each of the persons so named, at least one week prior to such meeting.

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Sec. 4. Recording certificate; fees. Before commencing business, the aforesaid corporation shall make and record a certificate of incorporation in accordance with the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 54, section 4, within the time limit therein expressed and pay the fees as required by said section 4.
