# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

#### AN ACT Decreasing Minimum Food Sale in Class A Restaurants Under Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 61, § 1, amended.** The 2nd and 3rd sentences of that part of section 1 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 340 of the public laws of 1959, which defines "Class A restaurant" are amended to read as follows:

'Year round class A restaurants must do a minimum of <del>\$50,000</del> **\$25,000** per year in sale and service of food to the public on their premises. Part-time licensees must do a minimum of <del>\$30,000</del> **\$15,000** business in sale or service of food to the public on their premises.'
