STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT to Increase the Borrowing Capacity of the Topsham Sewer District, to Authorize the Town to Contribute to Construction Costs and Otherwise Amend the Charter.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1957, c. 128, § 9, amended. The first sentence of section 9 of chapter 128 of the private and special laws of 1957 is amended to read as follows:

'For accomplishing the purposes of this act and for such other expenses as may be necessary for the carrying out of said purposes, the district, through its trustees, without district vote, is authorized to issue its notes and bonds in one series or in separate series from time to time and to make subsequent renewals of the same in whole or in part to an amount not exceeding the sum of \$200,000 \$300,000.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1957, c. 128, § 12, amended. Section 12 of chapter 128 of the private and special laws of 1957, as enacted by chapter 128 of the private and special laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 12. Application. The provisions of the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 53, and amendments thereto, do not apply to the Topsham Sewer District, except for those sections specifically referred to in this charter.'

Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1957, c. 128, § 13, additional. Chapter 128 of the private and special laws of 1957 is amended by adding a new section 13, to read as follows:

'Sec. 13. Town of Topsham authorized to contribute to construction costs.

The Town of Topsham may from time to time contribute to the expense of construction and reconstruction of sewers belonging to the Topsham Sewer District up to but not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ the costs of such construction by so voting at any annual or special town meeting. Said town may raise money for such purposes in whole or part by taxation or may issue its notes for the payment of its share in whole or part or may issue its bonds under the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 53, section 137 for the payment of its share in whole or part.'
