STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for Retirement and Pension for Stephen A. Regina of Saco.

Stephen A. Regina; retirement pension. Resolved: That the Chief of the Maine State Police is authorized and directed to retire Trooper Detective Stephen A. Regina at a pension of \$104 per week, which is his regular pay, for the rest of his life, and to extend to him those medical benefits to which an active member of the Maine State Police is entitled.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Trooper Detective Stephen A. Regina was shot and critically wounded in Limerick, Maine, on May 14, 1959, while in the performance of his duties as a Maine State Police Officer, and as a result of this wound, he is now and will be permanently and totally incapacitated.
