**RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys to Match Federal Funds Provided Under
Title VIII of the National Defense Education Act.**

Appropriating moneys to match federal funds. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$35,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964 and the sum of \$65,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965 for the purpose of matching federal funds made available for technical education under the provisions of Title VIII of the National Defense Education Act; and be it further

Resolved: That these funds be a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1965; and be it further

Resolved: That upon receipt of allotment duly approved by the Governor and Council based on work programs submitted to the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures of this appropriation on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Under Title VIII of the National Defense Education Act of 1958 (Title III of the George-Barden Act) the following funds have been allotted to Maine during the present biennium:

Fiscal year ending June 30, 1962	\$85,341
Fiscal year ending June 30, 1963	85,341

Less than \$10,000 of these funds could be used during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 and it is estimated that less than \$15,000 can be used during the present fiscal year for lack of qualifying matching funds.

There is need of expanded technical training in Maine and these funds could be used advantageously for technician training if matching funds were made available. Funds not used by Maine are reallocated to other states.
