COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 390, L.D. 589, Bill, "An Act
Relating to Classifying Part of Medomak River and Certain
Waters In and Bordering Waldoboro."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause,
the following emergency preamble:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do
not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
as emergencies; and

Whereas, pollution of the waters of Maine is one of Maine's
most serious and imminent problems which must be solved as soon
as possible; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary that the desire for clean
waters must be tempered with the economic and recreational growth
of Maine; and

Whereas, the following legislation is necessary to prevent
undue hardship on the inhabitants of Maine; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine,
and require the following legislation as immediately necessary
for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety;
now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof the
following emergency clause:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.'
