HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 394, L. D. 593, Bill, "An Act
Creating a Sewer District in the Town of Corinna."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause,
the following emergency preamble:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature
do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the
Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, disposal of sewage is essential to the health
and well-being of the inhabitants of the Town of Corinna; and

Whereas, it is imperative that action be taken at the
earliest possible time to eliminate any danger to such health
and well-being; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these
facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution
of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the first
sentence of the Referendum, including the headnote, and inserting
in place thereof the following:

'Emergency clause; referendum; effective date. In
view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take
effect when approved, only for the purpose of permitting its
submission to the legal voters of the Town of Corinna at a special
town meeting called and held for the purpose no later than 90 days
after the effective date of this act.'

Further amend said Bill, in the Referendum, by striking
out in the 7th and 9th lines the word "selectmen" and inserting in
place thereof the words 'registrar of voters'
