RESOLVE, in Favor of Certain Inhabitants of Webster Plantation, Penobscot County.

Certain inhabitants of Webster Plantation; land deeded to. Resolved: That the Forest Commissioner deed certain portions of the public lot in Webster Plantation to the following:

Byron Dill 50 acres
George Smith 1.4 acres
Myra Jipson Heirs 52 acres
Elden Worster .8 acre.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The persons named are descendants of the early settlers on the public lot in Webster Plantation and have been paying taxes on the property for many years. At town meeting in March of 1962, an article was passed to approach the Forest Commissioner and the Legislature to see if title could be conveyed so these persons could have title to the improved land as well as the old homesteads. The acreage to be conveyed is waste land and fields and includes no forest growth. Field men from the Forestry Department have surveyed these lots, following old fences and spots which have existed since the 1800's.
