STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Repealing the Teaching of Military Tactics at the University of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1865, c. 532, § 10, repealed. Section 10 of chapter 532 of the private and special laws of 1865 is repealed, as follows:

'See. to. Military tactics to be taught; students required to form, etc.; Adjutant General to furnish arms, etc. Military tactics shall be taught, during some suitable part of each year, to all the students; and they shall be required to form and maintain such habits of obedience and subordination, as may be useful to them, if called into military service. The adjutant general shall be authorized to furnish to the college, for military drill, such arms and equipments, not needed by the state for other service, as may suffice for the number of students. He shall also furnish to the college a United States flag.'
