# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

## AN ACT Increasing Number of Superintending School Committee of Town of Milo.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, in order to provide better administration of the schools of Milo for the benefit of the children of said town, the following legislation is vitally necessary; and

Whereas, the legal voters of the Town of Milo should be permitted to vote whether or not to increase the number of the school committee at the annual town meeting in March, 1963; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1937, c. 25, § 2, sub-§ (C), repealed and replaced. Subsection (C) of section 2 of chapter 25 of the private and special laws of 1937 is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- '(C) Superintending school committee. The Town of Milo may increase the membership of the superintending school committee to 5 members. The Town of Milo may choose by ballot at its annual town meeting 3 additional superintending school committee members to serve with the 2 members already

in office, and shall fill vacancies arising therein at each subsequent annual town meeting. The 3 members thus chosen shall designate by lot one member to serve 2 years and the other 2 members to serve 3 years; and they shall certify such designation to the town clerk to be by him recorded; and thereafter the members shall be chosen by ballot at the annual meeting of the Town of Milo to hold office for 3 years.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
