# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Terms of Office of Commissioners of the Portland Renewal Authority.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1951, c. 217, § 4, sub-§ (c), amended. Subsection (c) of section 4 of chapter 217 of the private and special laws of 1951 is amended to read as follows:
  - '(c) When the city council adopts a resolution as aforesaid, if the resolution adopted is one approving the exercise of powers hereunder by a Slum Clearance and Redevelopment Portland Renewal Authority created for said city, the city council shall appoint a board of commissioners of such authority which shall consist of 5 commissioners. The commissioners who are first appointed pursuant to this law shall be designated to serve for terms of 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 years, respectively, from the date of their appointment, but thereafter commissioners shall be appointed as aforesaid for a term of office of 5 3 years, except that all vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term, provided that the terms of office of commissioners as existing on the effective date of this amendment shall not be terminated and each shall continue in office until the end of his term unless a vacancy shall occur, in which event such vacancy shall not be filled for the unexpired term but shall be filled as an original appointment for a term of 3 years.'
