AN ACT Relating to Superintending School Committee of Town of Winslow.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 100th Legislature enacted a law permitting towns to choose 5 members of the superintending school committees; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to permit the inhabitants of the Town of Winslow to vote on its superintending school committee at the annual town meeting in March, 1963; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Election of superintending school committee. The certificate filed by the town clerk certifying acceptance of the private and special laws of 1961, chapter 57, shall be deemed to incorporate the intent of the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 41, section 45 and the town is authorized to proceed to elect the superintending school committee at the 1963 annual town meeting in accordance with said chapter 41, section 45. The town clerk shall issue nomination papers and prepare the ballot in accordance with said chapter 41, section 45.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1961, c. 57, repealed. Chapter 57 of the private and special laws of 1961 is repealed.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
