IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Reclassifying Photographer II, Department of Economic Development, as Exhibit Director.

Photographer II, Department of Economic Development, reclassified as Exhibit Director; appropriation. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund, the sum of \$7,787 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964 and the sum of \$8,330.50 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965 for the reclassification of the present Photographer II of the Department of Economic Development as Exhibit Director.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This employee entered state service as a Photographer I and has been a valued employee for 10 years, with responsibilities and activities which have increased far beyond those of his present rating. He not only has carried on the technical, production and supervisory duties of a Photographer II but he has for the past 3 years been responsible for the creation and management of all DED shows and exhibits. Under his management the state program of promotion through participation in travel and industrial shows has grown from 2, where it remained static for several years, to as many as 12 per year, scattered throughout the nation and beyond, from Miami to Montreal. He also manages the Maine Building and exhibits at the annual Eastern States Exposition at West Springfield, Massachusetts, and the annual Maine Products Show. He designs and arranges for the display of posters and window displays to advertise Maine in metropolitan areas. He has regular supervision over 3 male employees, one of whom receives a salary higher than his. During installation and take-down of shows he supervises as many as 12 employees. His duties have required an annual average of 650 hours of uncompensated overtime and loss of vacation time. The major credit for the enviable reputation which Maine shows and exhibits enjoy wherever they are displayed belongs to this devoted and valued employee.
