RESOLVE, Discharging Town of Liberty from Indebtedness to Maine School District Commission for Preparation of Agreement for Dissolution of School Administrative District No. 3.

Town of Liberty discharged from indebtedness to Maine School District Commission. Resolved: That the indebtedness of the Town of Liberty, as the municipality petitioning for dissolution of School Administrative District No. 3, for reimbursement for the expenses paid by the Maine School District Commission for employment of competent advisers in preparing the agreement of dissolution of said district, as provided in the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 41, section 111-P, is hereby discharged.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Town of Liberty, as a participating municipality of School Administrative District No. 3, after voting on June 2, 1961, petitioned the Maine School District Commission for dissolution of the district. The Maine School District Commission, upon finding that 2/3 of the voters in the Town of Liberty had voted on the petition, retained a law firm as advisers in preparing the agreement for dissolution, provided under the Revised Statutes, chapter 41, section 111-P. The bill of \$8,602.83 for the firm's services was paid by the Maine School District Commission on October 23, 1961. The commission, following a negative vote by the participating municipalities on dissolution, claims rembursement of this amount under the Revised Statutes, chapter 41, section 111-P, from the Town of Liberty. The purpose of this resolve is to discharge the Town of Liberty from payment.
