AN ACT Prohibiting Dogs Running at Large.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 96-A, amended. Section 96-A of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 96-A. Dogs running at large. ~~From February 1st to April 30th of each calendar year it~~ It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog to permit said dog to roam-at-large in any area frequented by deer. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, and costs.

The owner or keeper of any dog that is permitted to roam-at-large, and kills or causes injuries making it necessary to destroy the deer, shall be punished by a fine of \$100.'
