STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Amending Certain Provisions of the Charter of the Town of Old Orchard Beach.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1961, c. 153, Art. III, § 12, amended. The first paragraph of section 12 of Article III of chapter 153 of the private and special laws of 1961 is amended to read as follows:

'It shall be the duty of the council to prepare a budget to present to the town meeting members on the first Monday in March February, and it shall contain:

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1961, c. 153, Art. VI, § 3, amended. Section 3 of Article VI of chapter 153 of the private and special laws of 1961 is amended by adding a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'Whenever the office of a town meeting member shall become vacant by death, resignation or other disability, the town meeting members from within that district may meet, and by majority vote of those present, elect a town meeting member to complete the unexpired term.'

- Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1961, c. 153, Art. VI, §§ 9 10, additional. Article VI of chapter 153 of the private and special laws of 1961 is amended by adding 2 new sections, to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 9. Roll call vote. No article shall become a law unless on its final passage the vote be taken by yeas and nays, and the names of the persons voting for and against the same be entered upon a record which shall be transmitted to and permanently kept by the town clerk. Such records shall be subject to article VII, section 2.

Sec. 10. Advice and opinions. Any member of the representative town meeting may request the opinion or advice of any town official or any other individual who may contribute to or assist in any manner the town meeting membership.'
