STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Mileage and Expenses for Members of Legislature.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 10, § 2, amended. The first sentence of section 2 of chapter 10 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

'Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall receive \$1,600 for the regular session of the Legislature, and shall be paid for travel at each legislative session once each week at the same rate of 5e per mile to and from his place of abode as state employees receive, the mileage to be determined by the most reasonable direct route.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 10, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 10 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding after the first paragraph, a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be reimbursed for his actual expenses, other than travel, in attending the daily sessions of the Legislature in accordance with the expense reimbursement procedure governing state employees.'

Sec. 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated to the Legislative Appropriation from the General Fund the sum of \$116,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965 to carry out the purposes of this act.
