STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Tuition and Conveyance to Other than Public Schools in Another State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 41, § 93, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 93 of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 114 of the public laws of 1961, is amended to read as follows:

"When an administrative unit adjacent to an administrative unit in another state has too few scholars for the profitable maintenance of an elementary school or when pupils live remote from any public elementary school in an administrative unit in which they reside, the superintending school committee or school directors may pay tuition and provide conveyance to a school in an administrative unit adjacent to the State of Maine in another state, and the superintending school committee in such cases may pay tuition to a school other than a public school when authorized to do so by the administrative unit and may provide conveyance to and from schools other than public schools in accordance with chapter 90-A, section 12, subsection III, paragraph E.'
