AN ACT Relating to Attendance Officers of Passamaquoddy Indian Tribe.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 377, amended. Section 377 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding after the 5th sentence the following new sentence:

'The said children of the Passamaquoddy tribe shall be subject to all compulsory attendance laws as provided in chapter 41, sections 89 to 97, except that the superintendent of schools of the Town of Perry or of the school union of which Perry may be a member and the commissioner shall jointly have full authority to enforce the full provisions of said attendance laws at Pleasant Point and for purposes of such enforcement the attendance officer for the Town of Perry shall act as attendance officer for Pleasant Point, and the superintendent of schools of the Town of Princeton or of the school union of which Princeton may be a member and the commissioner shall jointly have full authority to enforce the full provisions of said attendance laws at Peter Dana's Point, and for purposes of such enforcement the attendance officer for the Town of Princeton shall act as attendance officer for Peter Dana's Point.'
