STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Criminal Sanctions Provisions of the Banking Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 59, § 1-K, amended. The last sentence of the 2nd paragraph and all of the 3rd paragraph of section 1-K of chapter 59 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 385 of the public laws of 1961, are repealed as follows:

'A director or trustee shall be deemed to participate in any action of which he has knowledge taken or omitted to be taken by the board of which he is a member unless he dissents therefrom in writing and promptly notifies the commissioner of his dissent.

Unless otherwise provided by statute, it shall be no defense to a criminal prosecution that the defendant did not know the facts establishing the criminal character of the act or omission charged if he should reasonably have known such facts in the proper performance of his duty.'
