**AN ACT Permitting Hearing Testimony in Liquor Hearings as to Statements by
Minors.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61, § 56, sub-§ I, amended. The 11th sentence of subsection I of section 56 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by chapter 218 of the public laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:

'In the conducting of hearings, no hearsay testimony shall be admissible and the licensees named in the complaint shall have the right to have all witnesses testify in person at the hearing, **except that in licensee violations involving minors if the minor has left the State or the country, or is otherwise inaccessible, the investigating officer shall have the right to testify as to all and every part of his investigation including statements made by the minor in the presence of the licensee, his clerk, servant or agent.**'
