STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Furnishing Liquor to Certain Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 61, § 70, amended. Section 70 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 196 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows :

'Sec. 70. Procuring, furnishing, giving or delivering liquor to certain persons. Whoever knowingly procures or in any way aids or assists in procuring liquor or whoever furnishes, gives or delivers liquor to a minor who may not legally purchase liquor for himself or for any intoxicated person, pauper, ~~insane~~ **mentally ill** person or person of known intemperate habits, except that this provision shall not apply to liquor served to a minor in the home, shall be punished by a fine of not **less than \$50 nor** more than \$100 **which fine shall not be suspended** or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both.'
