STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Furnishing Liquor to Certain Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61, § 70, amended. Section 70 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 196 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 70. Procuring, furnishing, giving or delivering liquor to certain persons. Whoever knowingly procures or in any way aids or assists in procuring liquor or whoever furnishes, gives or delivers liquor to a minor who may not legally purchase liquor for himself or for any intoxicated person, pauper, insane mentally ill person or person of known intemperate habits, except that this provision shall not apply to liquor served to a minor in the home, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 which fine shall not be suspended or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both.'
