STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting a General Contractor to Bid Unless Able to Perform Part of Work with Own Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 137, § 55, additional. Chapter 137 of the Revised Statutes, as amended is further amended by adding a new section 55, to read as follows:

'Bids of General Contractor.

Sec. 55. Bids of general contractor. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to advertise himself as, submit bids as, or accept work as a general contractor in the State of Maine unless he is capable of, intends to and actually does with his own forces at least 25% of the total work on any single project. Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100. Each day that the violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.'
