IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Regulating Taking of Striped Bass from Coastal or Tidal Waters of
York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37-A, § 80-A, additional. Chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 331 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding a new section 80-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 80-A. Striped bass from York County. It shall be unlawful for any person to take by rod and reel, or by line and hook, and keep in possession more than 10 striped bass per day from the coastal or tidal waters of York County. The minimum length of each striped bass so taken and retained in possession shall be not less than 16 inches.

Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of \$10 and an additional \$5 for each fish under the minimum size limit and \$5 for each fish in excess of the daily limit.'
