AN ACT Relating to Certificate of Registration to Practice Barbering.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 230-K, amended. The last paragraph of section 230-K of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 4 of chapter 359 of the public laws of 1961, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Any barber who fails to practice barbering for at least a minimum of 6 months during the 3-year period prior to application shall successfully pass a regular examination conducted by the Board of Barbers before a new certificate may be issued. Licensed barbers entering the armed forces, and any licensed barber who can furnish an affidavit from a licensed physician certifying that applicant was unable to practice barbering due to illness or injury, shall be exempt from this section and may renew his certificate only after payment of all unpaid renewal fees.'
