STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Taking Shellfish by Commercial Shellfish and Marine Worm Licensee.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 37-A, § 61, sub-§ VII, amended. Subsection VII of section 61 of chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 331 of the public laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:
 - 'VII. Licensee's authority to take worms and shellfish. The holder of a current commercial shellfish and marine worm license may dig or take shellfish, marine worms, clamworms, bloodworms or sandworms in any of the tidal waters or flats of the State, except in those areas which are closed to the digging or taking of such worms for conservation purposes the same by regulation passed under the provisions of sections 16 or 17.
 - A. The holder of a current commercial shellfish license may also buy or sell any of the above described worms or shellfish.'
