STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Jurisdiction of Juvenile Courts Over Juveniles Using Vehicle Without Authority.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 152-A, § 4, amended. The last paragraph of section 4 of chapter 152-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 377 of the public laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:

'Juvenile courts shall have no jurisdiction over offenses in which any juvenile is charged with the violation of any provision of chapter 22 or over any other traffic law or ordinance, if such offense is a misdemeanor, except that juvenile courts shall have exclusive, original jurisdiction over offenses in which any juvenile is charged with a violation of chapter 22, sections 149, 150 and 151-B.'
