AN ACT Providing a Sports License for Taking Lobsters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37-A, § 68-A, repealed and replaced. Section 68-A of chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 204 of the public laws of 1961, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 68-A. Lobster sports license. The commissioner may issue a lobster sports license to take lobsters by swimming or diving to any person who has been a legal resident of the State for at least 3 years next prior to the date of his application, which shall be valid from July 1st to November 30th in the year in which issued. The fee for a lobster sports license is \$10, which the applicant shall enclose with his application. The licensee shall be entitled to take not more than 10 lobsters in any one day, nor to have more than 10 lobsters in his possession at any one time.'
