AN ACT to Provide for Special Deputy Clerks of Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 89, § 106, amended. Section 106 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 172-A of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1961, is further amended by adding after the first paragraph a new paragraph, to read as follows:

‘The clerk of the judicial court in each county may appoint one or more special deputy clerks to serve at the pleasure of the clerk, whose powers and duties shall be limited to those contained in the certificate of appointment. Each such appointment shall be approved by any Justice of the Superior Court or by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court. The clerk in each county shall be responsible for all of the official acts of any special deputy so appointed. Before entering upon his official duties, each special deputy shall be sworn and if the clerk deems it advisable, he shall give bond to the clerk, approved by the county commissioners and lodged in the office of the county treasurer, in the sum of \$8,000, conditioned that he will faithfully perform the duties of his office. Such special deputy shall be paid for each day of actual service an amount set by the clerk and approved by the county commissioners.’
