AN ACT Relating to Secondary School Privileges.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 41, § 107, amended. The first paragraph of section 107 of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by section 4 of chapter 259 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read as follows:

'No youth shall be entitled to free tuition under this section if the administrative unit where the parent or guardian maintains a home for the family provides 2 or more occupational courses by maintaining an approved secondary school and contracting for occupational courses in a nearby approved secondary school.'
