STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Reciprocal Registration for Pharmacists.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, there are many Maine communities that do not have any registered pharmacists; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary in order to supply more pharmacists to the various communities of the State and thus aiding their wellbeing and health; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 68, § 6, amended. The next to the last sentence of the first paragraph of section 6 of chapter 68 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Persons of good character who have become registered as pharmacists by examination in other states prior to July 3, 1931 **1941** shall be required to satisfy only the requirements which existed in this State at the time when they became registered in such other states; and provided also that the state in which such person is registered shall, under like conditions, grant reciprocal registration as a pharmacist, without examination, to pharmacists duly registered by examination in this State.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
