STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Permitting Penobscot Indians a Limited Open Season on Moose on Indian Lands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 90-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 90-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 90-A. Limited open season on moose for Penobscot Indians. Notwithstanding section 90, there shall be for the members of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians on the reservation lands of the tribe a 5-day annual open season on moose, Sundays excepted, beginning November 1st in each calendar year.'
