**AN ACT To Provide Compulsory Driver Education for Certain Motor Vehicle
Law Violators.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 167, additional. Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 167 to read as follows:

'Sec. 167. Court may order persons convicted to attend driver education school. Any court having jurisdiction over violations of this chapter may, in addition to any other penalty imposed, order any person convicted of any violation of this chapter to attend any driver education school or program located within 15 miles of the respondent's home for a specified time for a complete course of instruction or a specified area of instruction, such course or instruction to be completed on or before a date specified in the order.

I. License suspension for failure to comply. The Secretary of State may, after hearing, suspend the respondent's license or right to operate motor vehicles in the State of Maine for willful failure to comply with the court order provided in this section.'
