**AN ACT Relating to Notice to Town of Settlement When Persons Found
Destitute.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 94, § 27-A, additional. Chapter 94 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 27-A, to read as follows:

**'Sec. 27-A. Notice to town of settlement when person found destitute. With-
in 7 days after the overseers determine that a person found in their town and
having no settlement therein is destitute and that relief is necessary, they shall
notify the municipality of apparent settlement or the State, if there appears to
be no settlement, of the facts.'**
