AN ACT Prohibiting Planting Fish in Great Ponds Inaccessible to Public.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 62-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 62-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 62-A. Planting fish in great ponds. No fish or fish spawn raised by the State shall be planted or deposited in the waters of any great pond which is not accessible to the public by a public way or by a private way which is continuously opened to the public.'
