IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Fees in Disclosure Proceedings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 120, § 42, amended. The first 4 sentences of section 42 of chapter 120 of the Revised Statutes are repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘The judge shall be entitled to a fee of \$5. The petitioner shall be entitled to a fee of \$5 in every case. The fees of officers shall be the same as for service of other process of similar nature. The petitioner may, if the judge authorizes it, procure an officer to be in attendance during the proceedings, and the fees for such attendance shall be the same as for attendance in the District Courts. The fees of the judge and officers shall be paid by the petitioner and, in case the oath named in section 56 is administered, shall be added to the costs on the judgment and execution and taxed in detail thereon by the judge.’
