STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Revising Laws on Dogs in Unorganized Territory.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 100, § 26, repealed and replaced. Section 26 of chapter 100 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 26. Dogs in unorganized territories. The Commissioner of Agriculture is authorized to appoint a dog recorder or recorders in unorganized territories and reservations. Said recorders shall list all dogs 4 months old or over, owned or kept by any inhabitants on April 1st, setting the number and sex thereof opposite the names of their respective owners and keepers. Said returns shall be made to the Commissioner of Agriculture on or before the first day of June following.

The dog warden shall issue licenses, receive the money therefor and pay the same to the Treasurer of State who shall credit the same to the General Fund. Such recorders shall keep a record of all licenses issued by them, with the names of the owners or keepers of dogs licensed and the sex, registered numbers and description of all such dogs. The sex, registered number and description shall not be required of dogs covered by a kennel license.

Fee for the recorder's service shall be determined by the Commissioner of Agriculture.'
