## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Permitting Municipalities Choice of Grades in Forming School Administrative Districts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 41, § 111-E, amended. The first paragraph of section 111-E of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1-B of chapter 364 and as repealed and replaced by section 2 of chapter 443, both of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

'The School District Commission may approve the formation of School Administrative Districts which had at least 300 250 resident secondary pupils educated at public expense in grades 9 through 12 as indicated in the last returns made to the commissioner of Education under section 71.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 41, § 111-F, amended. The first paragraph of section 111-F of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1-B of chapter 364 and as repealed and replaced by section 2 of chapter 443, both of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

'The residents of and the territory within 2 or more municipalities may form a School Administrative District, which shall be a body politic and corporate, to include grades one through 12 to include only grades 9 through 12 at the option of the municipalities, by proceeding as follows:'
