STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Out-of-State Credit for Service of Members of Maine State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 63-A, § 4, sub-§ XII, ¶ C, additional. Subsection XII of section 4 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955, is amended by adding a new paragraph C, to read as follows:

‘C. Out-of-state service rendered by any member under a similar contributory retirement system administered by another state or political subdivision shall be allowed as additional creditable service for any such member in the determination of his retirement allowance under any provision of this chapter, regardless of the number of years of his creditable service in Maine, provided that such other system shall transfer to the Maine State Retirement System for deposit in the appropriate funds all contributions made to it on behalf of such member on account of such service rendered in such state or political subdivision; and the board of trustees of the Maine State Retirement System is authorized, upon application by a member, to transfer to any such system as creditable service in the determination of his retirement allowance under the provisions of such system, all contributions made to it on behalf of said member of the Maine State Retirement System who shall become a contributory member of the retirement system of such other state or political subdivision.’
