# STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

### AN ACT Relating to Registration of Sanitarians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, §§ 159-A - 159-C, additional. Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding 3 new sections to be numbered 159-A, 159-B and 150-C, to read as follows:

## 'Registration of Sanitarians.

Sec. 159-A. Examinations. The Director of Personnel shall determine the character, type and content of examination for applicants for registration as sanitarians and shall conduct examinations for such applicants. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of not more than \$25, to be used by the director to defray the expenses incurred in conducting such examinations. Any applicant who fails to pass such examination shall be entitled to a re-examination within 6 months upon the payment of an additional fee of not more than \$25.

Sec. 159-B. Registration. The Department of Health and Welfare, through the Bureau of Health, shall grant to each person who has successfully passed the examination required by section 150-A a certificate designating such person as a registered sanitarian. The fee for such certificate shall be \$5 and such certificate shall be renewed annually on payment of a fee of \$5. Such fees shall be used by the Bureau of Health to defray the expenses incurred in carrying out this section.

Sec. 159-C. Present practitioners. Persons meeting the following qualifications shall be eligible for registration under sections 159-A and 159-B:

I. Personnel Law. Any person who on or before January 1, 1964 has passed an examination given by the Director of Personnel qualifying him as a sanitarian or in a related field, given by the State, provided that such person makes application for registration within 12 months of the effective date of this act.

II. Practicing sanitarian or in related fields. Any person who on or before January 1, 1964 has been employed as a practicing sanitarian or in related fields, may be considered for registration, provided such person applies for registration within 12 months of the effective date of this act.'
