STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Permit to Operate Certain Farm Trucks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 96-A, additional. Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 96-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 96-A. Permit for unladen, unregistered farm truck. Any officer of the State Police may upon request issue a written permit to operate an unladen, unregistered farm truck upon a public way when such truck is used upon the public ways occasionally or temporarily and solely for farm purposes. Such operation upon a public way shall be by an operator duly licensed under this chapter, and shall be from or to the premises where such farm truck is kept, to or from a farm lot and between farm lots, used for farm purposes by the owner of the farm truck, and from or to a filling station or garage for gas, oil or repairs. Each farm truck so operated shall be inspected by an authorized inspection station. No such permit shall be issued for a period to exceed one month, and shall specify the route or routes of travel and time of day during which such permit shall be valid.'
