STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting Sale or Purchase of Military Decorations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 14, § 84-A, additional. Chapter 14 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 84-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 84-A. Sale or purchase of military decorations prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to expose for sale, offer for sale, sell, pawn or pledge, or for any person to buy, purchase or loan money on any military badge, button, decoration or other insignia issued under the regulations of the army, air force, navy or marine corps of the United States or the National Guard. Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$20, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.'
