STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting Throwing of Rocks at any Public or Private Transportation Conveyance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 131, § 26-A, additional. Chapter 131 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 26-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 26-A. Throwing rocks at transportation vehicles. Whoever willfully throws or fires a rock, stone, bullet or any missile at any train, bus, truck or other form of public or private conveyance engaged in the transportation of passengers or freight shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500. If severe bodily injury or death results from such throwing or firing, it shall be deemed a felony.'
