STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting the Misuse of Railroad Signal Equipment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 46, § 83, amended. Section 83 of chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 83. Railroad signals, injuring or tampering with. Whoever intentionally and without right injures, destroys or molests any signal of a railroad corporation, or any line, wire, post, lamp or other structure or mechanism used in connection with any signal on a railroad, or destroys or in any manner interferes with the proper working of any signal on a railroad, or misuses any such signal shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not more than 2 years.'
