STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Clarifying the Use of Artificial Lights During Open Season for Hunting Deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 97-A, amended. Section 97-A of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 97-A. Use of artificial lights for lighting game. The use of artificial lights between ½ hour after sunset and ½ hour before sunrise to illuminate, jack, locate, attempt to locate or show up wild birds or animals shall be unlawful during open season on deer, except as provided in section 94, and section 113, subsection IV, and except during the open season for hunting deer with bow and arrow only.'
